October Pastor's Column

Has a preacher or someone ever asked you to serve on a church committee like the finance committee? What was your initial response? Undoubtedly it wasn't, "Yes, I would love to do that. I have been looking for an opportunity to attending boring meetings and experiencing conflict with some other people at church!" Unfortunately, this seems to be the prevalent attitude these days toward serving on committees and providing church leadership. Church meetings often become a drudgery

This is not the feeling I get when I read about church leadership in Ephesians 4: 11-13. After listing some of the gifts of ministry, the Apostle Paul speaks about the purpose and the goal the gifts of ministry play in church. Each Christian is called, gifted and empowered to do three things:

- 1. do the work of Christian ministry,
- 2. build a strong, vital and effective church,
- 3. personally grow and mature spiritually while serving until a sense of church unity and effectiveness emerges.

Paul has a vision of a strong and effective Christian church, and he wants the Ephesian Christians to catch this vision and then commit to making this vision a reality in their church.

Church service or leadership doesn't have to be boring or full of anxiety. There is a gifted Christian minister and leader in you. God intends you to experience a sense of joy and fulfillment in your church service and in your Christian leadership. The strength and effectiveness of our church, to a large extent, is entrusted to you.

Church service and ministry is not to be limited only to one hour on Sunday morning or once a month during the year. Our church will not grow if it is last on your list of priorities. There are so many opportunities for you to find fulfilling service in our church structure. The first step to finding meaningful Christian service is to begin to identify your gift/gifts for ministry. Do not neglect the gift that was entrusted into your care. You are gifted, called, and empowered. There is a wonderful church leader in you. God calls you to grow, bloom, and become fruitful at church.
