“You will keep in perfect peace all who trust in you, all whose thoughts are fixed on you.” Isaiah 26:3

Rebecca Ondov, a writer for the “Guideposts” magazine, shared a devotional that can help Christians forgive each other and keep the peace in their hearts. In her devotional, she told about the time she stood on her lawn and lobbed a bright green tennis ball for her Golden Retriever, Sunrise, to fetch. “While Sunrise raced away to catch the ball, Rebecca’s thoughts drifted to a situation where she felt she had been wronged. She said to herself, ‘God, they never should have done that!’ Over the past couple of days, she had played the memory of that wrong over and over in her head until it became a menacing movie. Worse still, she had lost her peace.

“Sunrise ran up to her with the ball in her mouth, and shifted her weight side to side with her eyes fixed on the ball. Rebecca let some of her anger out as she threw the ball a little harder than she should. Sunrise took off in hot pursuit. Too late to do anything about it, Rebecca grimaced as she watched the ball bounce into her garden and land among her tomato plants. Undeterred, Sunrise dove into the garden, but when Sunrise turned around to come back, Rebecca saw that, instead of the ball, she had a green tomato in her mouth. Suddenly, Sunrise stopped in midstride, puckered her brows, and spit the tomato out. Then the dog stalked around the tomato, cocking her head and making faces at it.

“Rebecca chuckled to herself as she realized what had happened. To Sunrise she said, ‘Tomatoes might look like a ball, but dogs aren’t supposed to bite into them.’ When those words came out of her mouth, Rebecca caught herself thinking, ‘and bad memories are like green tomatoes. Don’t bite them!’

“It occurred to her that by choosing to continually replay the menacing movie of being wronged, she was wasting her brain space and only creating animosity and torment for herself. So Rebecca picked up the green tomato and threw it in the trash can, along with the bad memory of being wronged.”

We don’t have to be ruled by emotions. God has given us emotions, yes, but also the gift of free will and the fruit of the Spirit called self-control. We have the ability to make hard choices and choose the path we want to take instead of being ruled by our emotions.
